



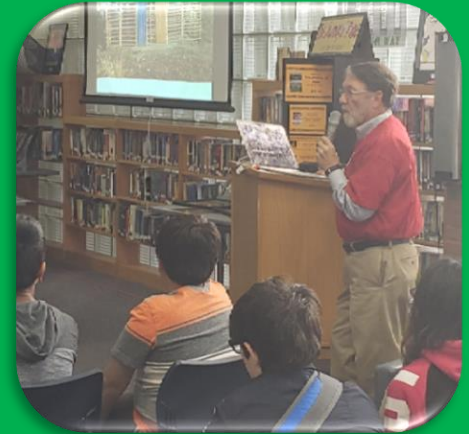
Dublin Davis Middle School
